Non-binary perspectives have long existed outside of gender identity conversations across many realms of life, and alternative ways of thinking are becoming increasingly normalized. Flexibility, multitasking, parallel lives – transitions of all kinds are fluid. The exhibition *POLY. A Fluid Show* brings together works by eleven international artists whose transdisciplinary practice takes painting as a starting point. They address themes like hustling, mixing, and queering, which transcend and break down boundaries between nations, genders, generations, digital and analogue cultures, and materials.

In the so-called West, we have so far focused our lives around doing one thing well (specialisation), having one identity (individual), loving one partner (monogamy), refining one ideal form (minimalism), cultivating one sort of wheat (monoculture), etc. One consequence is often monotony. The ongoing polycrisis of health, environmental, relational and military challenges requires us to adapt. It prompts us to broaden our skills and transform our lives, embrace diversity and accept that we may need variety in our loves and alliances, ways of living and working, and sources of sustenance and income. Proposals for diverse and communal polysolutions have been around for a long time – the artworks in the exhibition *POLY*. A Fluid Show give form to these ideas. The exhibition is polymorph, polyvalent, polyphonic, polyam, polycentric and polytheist.
